Since 1959, A Community Christmas (ACC) of Stark County, Inc. has been a local non-profit organization with a mission to help Stark County families during the Christmas season that are in need of food, toys, clothing and more.

65 Years of Giving and Gratitude

A Community Christmas (ACC) was able to provide a brighter Christmas for all families and individuals that qualified for aid in 2023 – 1,052 applicants, representing 604 families, and 448 senior citizens and disabled adults, for a total of 2,860 children and adults. Thank you to the many generous Stark County residents, organizations and businesses that made this possible!

Compared to ACC's 2022 program, there were significantly more clients and applications for Christmas aid in 2023. ACC forecasts that this trend will continue in 2024 due to the rising costs of daily necessities. Here's a recap of 2023's many increases:

- 26% More Total Clients/Applicants with 46% More Seniors/Disabled Adults
- 14% More Total Individuals Served
- 11% More Giving Center Recipients and 7% More Adopt-A-Families
- 6.5% More Toys, Gift Cards, Clothing & Household Items were Distributed
- 11% More Monetary Donors

Due to more monetary donations being received, ACC was able to distribute **1,928** food vouchers (\$31,160) to Giving Center families and seniors/disabled adults; **309** teen gift cards (\$12,360); and **28,348** mostly donated toys, gifts, books, bikes, toiletries, household items and clothing.

2023 ACC PROGRAMS

INTAKE

1,052 Qualified Applications

(604 family and 407 senior/disabled adult applicants), were received in 2023 representing 2,860 children and adults – a 14 % increase over 2022!

The intake procedure for 2023 allowed clients to either print out applications online and mail them to ACC, or drop them off during ACC's 3-Day Application Drop-Off Service at the American Legion **Canton Post 44** – thank you for letting us use your parking lot. Having two ways to submit applications was appreciated by our clients – 35% of the total applications were dropped off, while 65% were mailed (seniors prefer to mail applications). Thanks to the help of Catholic Charities, ACC was able to ensure that no applicant requested duplicate assistance or services from multiple organizations. Of the 1,052 applicants, 223 families were served by the Adopt-A-Family program, 381 families were served by the Christmas Giving Center, and 448 seniors/disabled adults received a food voucher. To ensure a smooth running and successful program, it took over **850 volunteer hours and 15** volunteers to collect, process and cross-check the 1,052 applications.

ADOPT-A-FAMILY

223 families (651 children and 281 adults)

were adopted in 2023, providing Christmas to 7% more families and individuals over 2022. Thank you to the individuals and companies that generously adopted families, especially to Faith United Methodist Church and Aultman Hospital who adopted many families. **ACC also thanks:**

We are grateful to our generous Adopt-A-Family donors and the more than 75 volunteers working more than 700 hours over 3 days to make Christmas merrier for so many people.

CHRISTMAS GIVING CENTER

381 families with 683 children, 309 teens and 488 adults (totaling 1,480 people, an

11% increase) were provided a merrier Christmas through the ACC ACC Giving Center. The Christmas Giving Center continued to use the popular **drive-by gift pick up** (rather than "in-person shopping") to distribute gifts and vouchers at the **Stark County Fairgrounds**. Each family's gifts were pre-bagged using suggestions from clients' information sheets. Highlights of the 2023 program include:

- Marines Toys for Tots provided AAC with enough items to give each child (under 12) 3-5 new toys, stocking stuffers, stuffed animals, books and a bike if requested (about 8,540 total items).
- Each of the 309 teens (age 13-19 in school full time, not college) received a \$40 Walmart gift card, totaling \$12,360. ACC is the only Christmas giving agency that provides gifts to teenagers.
- All 1,480 family members received a \$15 Fisher Foods food voucher, as well as hats and gloves (\$22,200 was spent on food vouchers).
- Each family received toilet paper, paper towels, a blanket, hand soap and tooth paste. Some families also received hand wipes, Kleenex, toothbrushes, Christmas decorations, boxes of food, clothing, coats, shoes and boots. \$3,223.90 was spent on these mostly taxable, non-food stamp items.

To make this 2-day program a success, ACC had over **50 volunteers** working **1,000 hours** to help with set up, shopping and bagging gifts for each family, traffic control, loading the drive-by cars and cleanup – **thank you.** We also thank the **Stark County Fairgrounds** for hosting the 2023 Giving Center and for agreeing to host it again in 2024; **Canton Chair and Table Rental** for discounted chairs and tables; and **Canton Road Garden Center** for loaning us their garden carts.

SENIORS/DISABLED ADULTS

448 Senior Citizens and Disabled Adults

(age 55+ or disabled) each received a \$20 food voucher to Fisher Foods, totaling **\$8,960**. Compared to 2022, **46% more seniors** were helped during the holidays. This increase corresponds to an increase in mail-in applications, which seniors/disabled adults prefer due to transportation or mobility issues. Therefore, ACC will always keep the mail-in option for seniors to make their application submittal easier.

VOLUNTEERS

Over 675 volunteers worked 3,800+ hours

in the many 2023 ACC programs in various capacities (intake, applicant processing, pickup, sorting, setup, shopping, transporting and distribution). This includes at least 250 individuals who purchased gifts for Adopt-A-Family clients, and 310 church members, business employees and the public, who generously donated items to the Mitten Tree program. ACC volunteers' dedication of time, enthusiasm and hard work made it possible to give aid, gifts and clothing to more than 8,800 Stark County individuals through our various programs and distribution channels.

DONATIONS and GRANTS

\$57,807.16 in Monetary Donations were received in 2023 from grants, foundations, and donors (individuals, churches and businesses).

MITTEN TREE

6,747 Hats, Gloves, Scarves and Clothing items were collected in 2023.

Donated items came from 31 local Stark County churches, businesses, libraries and many individuals. All items collected were distributed to Stark County Community Health Clinics and Shelters, as well as Canton City and Plain Local Schools. We are incredibly thankful to all of those that support the Mitten Tree Program, especially the North Canton Public Library and Trinity United Church of Christ for being our collection site.

THE SEASON OF GIVING



\$46, 743.90 was spent on 2,860 Stark County children, adults, senior citizen & disabled adults. \$31,160 was spent on food vouchers for Giving Center families and senior citizens/disabled adults; \$12,360 was spent on \$40 Wal-Mart gift cards for Giving Center teens; and \$3,223.90 was used to purchase taxable, non-food stamp items for Giving Center families. The program also had expenditures such as postage, venue rentals, chair/table rental and security. Plus, normal nonprofit business operational expenditures including insurance, software and website updates, one part-time salary, storage, P.O. Box rental, accountants, and taxes. Office space and print advertising costs were donated by the **Canton Repository**. Remaining monies from 2023 will be used to start funding the 2024 program. This was truly a wonderful year of giving... and receiving. Thank you!

Donations are welcome and appreciated anytime. Donations received before mid-November are spent on clients for the current Christmas season (since that's when gift cards, food vouchers and household necessities are purchased), while donations received afterward are used for the next year's program.
